

## ANIMAL CONTROL ISSUES

This is information on animal control in the city limits of St. Robert

Please have your dog spayed or neutered

## ▶ Animals may not run at large and must be licensed

All dogs shall be kept on the owner or keeper's property by some type of confinement (such as a leash, fence, etc.). A dog may not run at large at any time.



I see your person cares about you!

Any time a dog is in a street, alley, thoroughfare, or public park or grounds within the city limits, that dog must be restrained by a leash or some other method of control in which the animal can be physically prevented from escaping.

### Dogs must be licensed

Owners of any dogs within the city limits are required to obtain a license for their pet each year. Licenses expire each year on January 1<sup>st</sup>. Licenses may be obtained at City Hall. Before a license will be issued, the owner/keeper must show proof of rabies vaccination.

The tag should be affixed to the dog's collar with a permanent metal fastener so that it may be easily seen by the Animal Control Officer and other City employees

### Animals must have rabies vaccinations

Owners must vaccinate their dog against rabies before they will be granted a license for their dog. Owners should display the metal rabies tag provided by your veterinarian on your animal's collar. A certificate shall accompany every application for a dog license from a qualified veterinarian showing that the dog has been given a rabies vaccination within the last 12 months.

### Rescue of Animals from Vehicles

Owners or operator of a motor vehicle shall not leave an animal confined in a motor vehicle under circumstances that could endanger its life. In the event the Animal Control Officer determines an animal is confined under these circumstances, the Animal Control Officer, with assistance from the Police, is authorized to enter the vehicle and rescue the animal and impound it.

### Annoying animals

It is unlawful for a person to own, keep or harbor any dog making loud, frequent or habitual yelping, howling or noise or fail to prevent or keep dog from doing any damage to lawn, garden or other property or fail to prevent his dog from biting, injuring, menacing or attacking any person.

The City does have a "Dangerous Dog" ordinance, as well as other rules and regulations governing the ownership of animals.
