Hello, Residents and Businesses of St Robert,

Welcome to Fall! Summer has moved on and the temperatures are cooling down and the length of daylight hours is getting shorter. I hope everyone had a fantastic summer and are looking forward to a nice fall season. The city moved as quickly as possible to complete projects during the summer months and several have been accomplished. Although, supply chain issues have heavily impacted city projects, upgrades, and maintenance.

I wanted to bring everyone up to date with some ongoing city projects.

- The Waynesville-St. Robert Regional Airport has been the biggest talk over the last few weeks. This is one of those projects that will continue to always have something upgrading or improvements for many years. The big news is that Contour Airlines is coming back to our airport. Contour Airlines has received approval from the Department of Transportation to fly from our airport to Nashville and Dallas almost daily. I reviewed Contour Airlines website and found three levels of pricing for flights to Dallas which started at \$103 roundtrip. Contour Airlines flights will start on October 18, with SkyWest Airlines continuing to fly to Chicago through October 17. Other airport projects include the awarding of \$12 million in grants to build a new airline terminal. We are currently developing the environmental policy and land leases from the government. These are long processes to go through and it will take a couple of years to complete. Additionally, we received another \$2.5 million to extend the taxiway the length of the runway. This latest grant was just approved and will also take a couple of years to complete. So, several improvements to the airport to provide better air transportation to our local community.
- The city's wastewater water treatment plant relocation is still under construction. For those who just recently moved into our city, in 2015 and 2017 our sewer plant flooded during large rain events. The flooding came from the Gasconade River which overflowed its banks. The Gasconade River is located about a quarter mile from our sewer plant. The Gasconade River is the main local river and everything drains into it. The river had flooded several times before since 1993, when the plant was originally built, but it had not flooded the plant. In 2015, the flood water reached the plant at about two feet above the protective wall. In 2017, it was almost five feet above the wall and took several days to go down. The result of the flooding of 2015 was the plant began operating on a temporary status while requesting FEMA grants to do repairs. The Corps of Engineers evaluated and recommended \$22.5 million dollars to rebuild the plant on the hill across from the current plant location. It took several meetings and process a ton of paperwork to receive approval. The relocation project has now been under construction since last year with another eighteen months to finish the construction. When complete, it should last 35-50 years for the city needs for sewer treatment.
- The last project I wanted to mention is the RV Park. We approved the concrete bid for the RV pads at our council meeting on September 20th and city employees are installing the sewer pump station and lines to serve the park. The drive through pads will be very nice and all locations will have full utilities hookups. The supply chain on getting all the pieces on hand has been a challenge, but we are now coming down to having almost all items needed. I look forward to having a finished park sometime later this year.

Again, I hope everyone had a fantastic summer. Fall is a season for a lot of local events to attend and spend time enjoying community events. The Waynesville School District Parade is September 30th and is always a great event. Several other parades include the Veterans Day parade and the Christmas parade. St. Robert will not have Halloween in the Park event this year but we are very happy to see so many locally who have trunk or treats events and we want to support those. So come on out and support your community.

RECYCLING

The city received a grant from the Missouri Department of Natural Resources and Ozark Rivers Solid Waste Management District to aid with recycling. Currently the city has recycling bins that can be signed out by single family dwellings, no apartment complexes. There are a limited amount of bins and they are issued on a first come basis. We will accept:

- Aluminum cans and clean foil.
- Paper: white paper, colored paper, brown envelopes, manila folders, junk mail, magazines and phone books; small amounts of staples are okay.
- Cardboard, corrugated boxes, paperboard (shoe, cereal & soda boxes), and shipping cartons.
- Plastic bottles: soft drink , single-use water bottles, sports drinks, clan food bottles, cosmetic container.
- Detergent bottles, milk and juice jugs (must be rinsed out).
- Steel and tin cans.

For your paper products, small quantities of paper must be put in bags or flattened out and bound with string.
